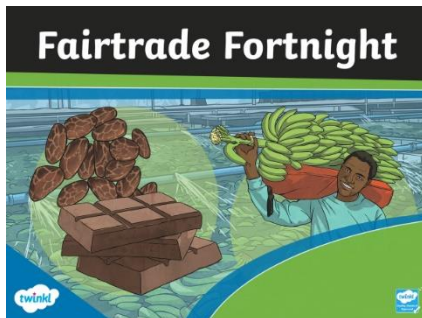

Monday	Thankfulness	Fairtrade fortnight	<i>This excellent Fairtrade Fortnight PowerPoint Presentation is a simple but effective way for you to help your class learn some key facts about Fairtrade Fortnight.</i> <i>This Fairtrade Fortnight PowerPoint is a great way of presenting information about Fairtrade Fortnight. The PowerPoint asks children to consider what is fair and what is not fair, and presents them with different scenarios - ideals for stimulating class discussion.</i> <i>Slides include information about the Fairtrade organisation, what fair trading is about, the many products that are traded fairly across the world today and what this means for the growers and workers involved.</i>

Why should we be thankful to people from other countries who provide food for our country? Why should children learn about Fairtrade Fortnight?

			Fair trade is a movement that aims to help disadvantaged people in developing countries, so it only makes sense for children to learn the importance of it. Teaching children about what fair trade is and how it helps people may inspire them to develop these positive values themselves. If you can show your kids how great fairness is, then maybe it can lead to them developing similar ideas about other things! If your kids can understand why fairness is so important, then they may start to learn the importance of other values, such as sharing or general kindness towards others. They also may feel inspired to take part in Fairtrade Fortnight themselves in some way. Getting involved with yearly events, especially ones that promote such a good cause, is a fantastically educational way of encouraging your kids to take part in events outside of school. What is fair trade? Fair trade is a system designed to help producers of goods in developing countries achieve fair and sustainable trade relationships! The movement focuses on commodities or products that are usually exported from those developing countries to developed countries. The products that are usually focused on are coffee, sugar, cocoa, fruit, flowers and gold! It seeks to promote greater fairness in international trade partnerships through dialogue, transparency and respect. Everyone deserves to earn a fair amount for their work, and fair trade is a great way of expressing this idea!
