Monday	Seeing the truth	<p>Optical Illusions Optics for Kids</p> <p>Values for life p242 – look at the above images of optical illusions. Ask the children what they see in the pictures. How do you feel when suddenly you see something new in the picture?</p> <p>We often use the phrase 'I see it now', for example, when we suddenly realise how to do a piece of numeracy work.</p> <p>Sometimes we have to look at something or a situation in a different way in order to understand the truth about it.</p> <p>What sort of things can make us blind to the truth? (Not listening to others carefully enough/ not concentrating/ not being prepared to change our mind/ thinking we are always right.)</p>
Tuesday		<p>Today we are going to hear the story of Saul, someone who thought he knew what was true. Saul believed that the Christians were wrong to follow Jesus and to trust in him, but he had a remarkable experience that made him change his mind.</p> <p>The Jesus storybook Bible p334 – A New Way to See, the story of Saul on the road to Damascus.</p> <p>Use two people outlines. Label one 'before' and one 'after'. Ask the children to describe Saul before and after his experience on the road to Damascus.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • How did his thoughts and beliefs about Jesus change? • What sort of changes did he have to make to the way he lived his life? • How do you think Christians felt about him at first? • Do you think they trusted him?

		Sometimes we have to be prepared to admit that we have not seen the complete picture and that we have not understood something truly. When this happens we have to be willing to admit our mistake and be prepared, to live our lives in a different way.
