


Children’s involvement in bold

	THEME	Resources/ display
Monday	Standing up for others who are treated unjustly	Use the PowerPoint about Nelson Mandela. Discuss with the children how he stood against injustices against black people in Africa and how people around the world campaigned for the release of Mandela.
Tuesday	Standing up for others who are treated unjustly	Today we are going to focus on someone else who famously stood up for themselves and others and helped to create change. Use the PowerPoint about Rosa Parks and use discussion points throughout to talk with the children.

Micah 6.8</p> <p>Today we are going to think about whether justice is always about treating everyone exactly the same or if it's a bit more complicated than that.</p> <p>Use a box of various coloured 3D blocks (all different) – Complete activity on p200 Afterwards use the reflection section to notice how, as a school community, we sometimes treat people differently, but always try to act justly and fairly. For example: younger children given longer to eat lunch.</p>
