Wednesday	Standing on God’s promises	<p>Roots and fruits p163</p> <p>Trust is the foundation on which all good friendships are built. But sometimes we can feel disappointed by our friends. Perhaps they haven’t done what they promised they would do, or maybe we thought they would stand by us when life was difficult and they didn’t.</p> <p>Human beings can occasionally be unreliable, but the Psalmist reminds us that God will never disappoint us.  <i>“My God is my strength in whom I trust.” Psalm 18.2</i></p> <p>God’s promises are true and we can trust them. They are a strong and sturdy platform that we can stand on.</p> <p>Use the drama on p164 and reflect upon which of God’s promises the children in the script need to be reminded of.</p>

Thursday	Standing on God's promises	Roots and Fruits p165 Fruits from the root's activity – Create a promise box. Each child has the opportunity to write or draw their promise to God that they have made to help someone they know who is worried about something at the moment. Put these in a sealed box so the children know their promise will be in confidence.

World Heritage refers to the places in the world that are very important and special. These special places are protected because they are valuable to everyone in the world.

African World Heritage Day is on the 5<sup>th</sup> of May each year. It is dedicated to celebrating the rich history and culture of African countries and is an opportunity for African people around the world to appreciate their unique customs.

African World Heritage Day honours and recognises the importance of **preserving** African places and heritage sites. These sites are recognised by **UNESCO** for their cultural, historical or natural significance.
